¹The CATC Thematic Core course that is met with a Music, Bachelor of Arts major is: MUCS 274: World Music (GP). Other Thematic Core courses should be chosen according to the Christ at the Core General Education checklist that can be found [here](#). The Advanced Integrative Seminar can also meet Thematic Core tags.

² Consider taking summer credits through Honey Rock and Wheaton in the Northwoods to satisfy Old and New Testament and CATC requirements.

³ 8 hours of credit is required from MUIP 201-MUIP 422. The first 3 semesters, courses should be chosen from MUIP 201-222. The last semester, this course should be chosen from MUIP 401-422. Prior to registration, students should consult with the Conservatory office coordinator on registration overrides for private lessons.

⁴ Note that all BA Music students must pass piano proficiency : Level 6 for piano majors, Level 2 for voice and all other instruments which may be met by testing or by piano class or private lessons; this should be completed by the end of sophomore year; piano lessons/class apply to Free Electives.

⁵ Music, Bachelor of Arts majors will also enroll and participate in a Large Music Ensemble (Women's Chorale, Men's Glee Club, Concert Choir, Symphony Orchestra, Symphonic Band, Jazz Ensemble) for 4 semesters; .5 credit will be given each semester.

⁶ Music electives should be chosen from MUCS, MUEP, MUIP, MUTC and MUMS courses.

⁷ Alternately MUTC 261⁵ can be taken in place of MUTC 241.

⁸ Free Electives can include both music and non-music courses. Note a maximum of 52 credits can be taken in music (MUCS, MUEP, MUIP, MUMS, MUTC).

- BA Music majors will enroll in Recital-Concert attendance (MUEP 219) every semester after their declaration of the BA music degree, which will give them opportunities to hear guest performers and speakers, as well as perform for their peers.

-Music History core classes (MUCS 261, 262, 263, 361) should be taken in order, if possible.
