<sup>1</sup>The CATC Thematic Core course that is met with a Bachelor of Music Education major is: MUCS 274: World Music (GP). Other Thematic Core courses should be chosen from Category II and Visual and Performing Arts sections of the Christ at the Core checklist for BM and BME students that can be found on the Academic Advising Office website. The Advanced Integrative Seminar can also meet Thematic Core tags.

<sup>2</sup> Consider taking summer credits through HoneyRock and Wheaton in the Northwoods to satisfy Old and New Testament and CATC requirements.

<sup>3</sup> 14 hours of credit is required from MUIP 201-MUIP 422. The first 4 semesters, courses should be chosen from MUIP 201-222. The last 4 semesters, these courses should be chosen from MUIP 401-422.

<sup>4</sup> Note that all students must pass piano proficiency; this should be completed by the end of sophomore year; piano lessons/class apply to Free Electives.

<sup>5</sup> Music majors will also enroll and participate in a Large Music Ensemble (Women's Chorale, Men's Glee Club, Concert Choir, Symphony Orchestra, Symphonic Band, Jazz Ensemble) each semester; .5 credit will be given each semester. Large ensemble is waived during the Student Teaching semester.

<sup>6</sup> Music electives should be chosen from MUCS, MUTC, and MUMS courses. 5 credits overall required. 2 of the 5 credits required must be chosen from MUCS 261, 355, 356, or 494. MUCS 494 is strongly recommended.

<sup>7</sup> 7 hours of Techniques courses required in Vocal Emphasis (chose from: MUMS 141, 245, 341).

<sup>8</sup> Music majors will enroll in Recital-Concert attendance (MUEP 219 – 0 hours) each semester, which will give them opportunities to hear guest performers and speakers, as well as perform for their peers. MUEP 219 is waived during the Student Teaching semester.

<sup>9</sup> Students should apply to WheTEP, Wheaton's Teacher Education Program, during EDUC 225. Students must successfully complete an interview ith Department of Education faculty to continue with the BME track. Students must also pass the ILTS music content exam prior to student teaching.

-Music History core classes (MUCS 262, 263, 274, 361) should be taken in order, if possible
