<sup>1</sup> Courses that meet the CATC Thematic Core tags: PHIL 245 (AAQR), PHIL 311 (HP, PI). Many 100 and 200 level elective courses carry Thematic Core tags. A maximum of 3 Thematic Core tags can be counted for both the major and CATC requirements.

<sup>2</sup> Integrated majors take 24 credits in philosophy and 16 credits in an integrated field, with a bridge course connecting the two disciplines (counts toward PHIL credits). At least 16 of the 24 PHIL credits must be upper division (300 or 400 level). All 16 credits of the integrated field may be counted as requirements for a double major. See the course catalog for the many options for an integrated Philosophy major.

<sup>3</sup> Students can choose to take the 2-credit PHIL 243 (Intro to Logic) or 4-credit PHIL 245 (Logic) to meet the requirement. PHIL 243 is the first half of the PHIL 245 class, and both are offered every semester.

<sup>4</sup>PHIL 311 and 312 (History of Philosophy) do not have to be taken in that order.

<sup>5</sup> PHIL 494 (Capstone) is offered every fall and some spring semesters and should be taken in the senior year.

<sup>6</sup> Philosophy majors can take BITH 374: Systematic Theology instead of BITH 315: Christian Thought.

-It is recommended that integrated philosophy majors take at least one PHIL 454 or 455 (Historical Seminar) and at least one PHIL 447 or 448 (Advanced Topics).
