¹ Courses that meet the CATC Core Shared Core requirement: ARCH 211 (Old Testament), ARCH 213 (New Testament), BITH 374 (Systematic Theology) or BITH 315 (Christian Thought). ARCH courses meet Thematic Core requirements: ARCH 365 (HP, SI), ARCH 366 (HP, SI), ARCH 369 (LE, PI), ARCH 325 (SI), ARCH 326 (GP, HI), ARCH 327 (SP). Elective courses in the major may also be Thematic Core tagged courses. A maximum of three may count for both the ARCH major and the CATC Thematic Core requirements.

² Excavation is not offered every year. It should be taken as soon as possible.

³ Students interested in studying for a semester in Jerusalem can fulfill 10-12 hours toward the major, including ARCH 334, ARCH 369, and courses in the Interdisciplinary Emphasis.

⁴ Six hours from the Wheaton in the Holy Lands (summer) program will replace ARCH 334 and ARCH 369 toward the completion of the major. More information about the Wheaton in the Holy Lands program, including the course offerings for a summer term, can be found through the Global Programs and Studies office or through the Wheaton in the Holy Lands program director. Students are encouraged to consult with their Archaeology advisor if they are considering participating in the Wheaton in the Holy Lands program.

⁵ The major requires 6 hours in 300-level courses for its Interdisciplinary Emphasis requirement. These courses can be from Anthropology, Sociology, Ancient Languages, Biblical Studies, or Geology.
