Our annual Life After Wheaton report gives us the opportunity to tell the story of how a Wheaton College education prepares students for their first next step after graduation. As we share the story of the Class of 2024, it bears remembering that this class started their college career at the height of the COVID-19 pandemic: their first semester was marked by social distancing, masks, and remote learning. These students persevered with optimism and grit, traits that clearly serve them well as they compete for early career roles.

- The Class of 2024 held internships at **366** locations throughout their time at Wheaton
- **26.4%** are continuing their education through graduate programs at **65** schools
- **211** different employers hired our 2024 graduates for full-time work

Graduates of the Class of 2024 have launched into a broad range of roles; from pastoral residents to medical residents, software consultants to interior designers, legal assistants to early childhood teachers. Regardless of industry, role, or job function, Wheaton College continues to equip graduates well for life after Wheaton.

The Center for Vocation and Career has the privilege of reporting this data, but we do not do this work alone. The landed rate on the following page represents a campus-wide labor of love to fulfill the College's mission: *to serve Jesus Christ and advance His Kingdom through excellence in liberal arts programs that educate the whole person to build the Church and benefit society worldwide.* Furthermore, these outcome numbers represent merely a snapshot in time for the Class of 2024. We will continue to cheer on these young alumni as they take their first vocational steps for Christ and His Kingdom.

Survey Methodology

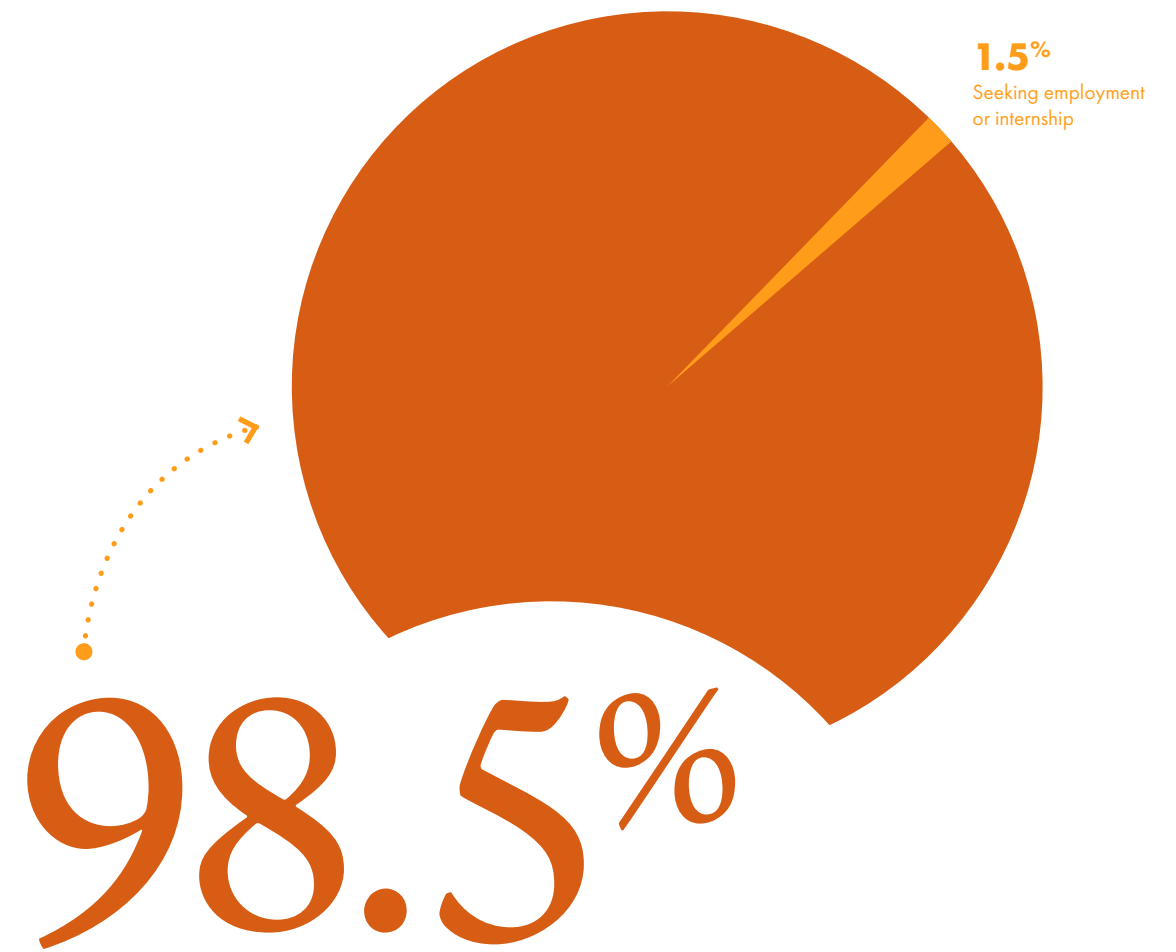
This survey is conducted according to the most recent guidelines from the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE), the professional association for college career services. NACE's First Destination Survey provides a standardized tool to measure how new college graduates fare in their careers within six months of graduation. Following NACE guidelines allows institutions to provide clear, concise, and comparable data on outcomes associated with a college education on a national scale (naceweb.org). To align with NACE standards and protocols, we include all latest known outcomes and reports on each graduate's primary area of activity as collected from an electronic survey administered by the Center for Vocation and Career, as well as verifiable job information from sources such as LinkedIn.

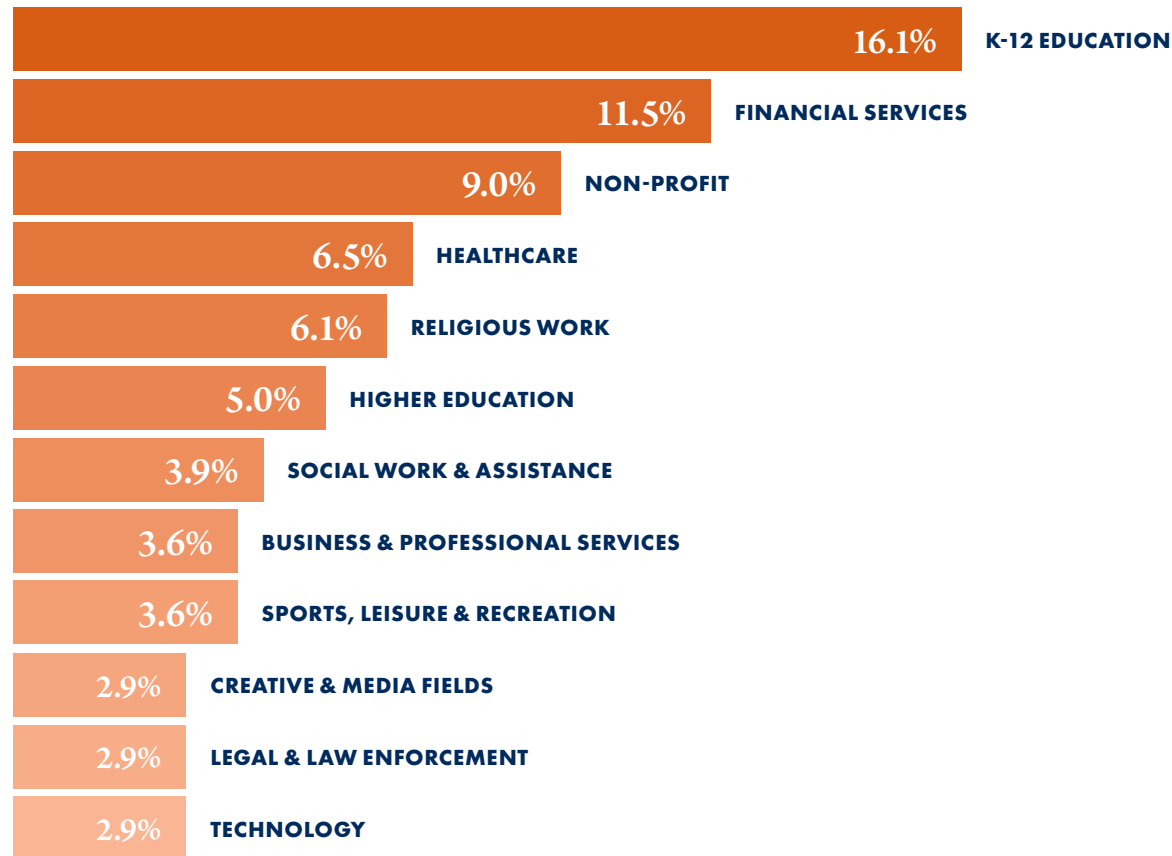

Landed: Clinical Research Technician and Recruiter at Brigham and Women's Hospital / Harvard Medical School Sleep Disordered Breathing Lab

During his four years at Wheaton, Josh was actively involved in Discipleship Ministries, served on the Pre-Health Ministry Team Cabinet, participated in Decision Point (formerly National School Project), and enjoyed regular participation in intramural sports. Now working in Boston, Josh engages with patients preparing for overnight sleep studies, recruits participants from healthcare databases, and ensures quality data collection and analysis. Though different than the activities he engaged in as a student, Josh credits his liberal arts education at Wheaton with preparing him for his current role and for teaching him to “never stop asking deep questions and seeking meaningful answers.” More specifically, Josh values how faculty and staff modeled that education exists for God's glory and the good of others. While he plans to return to graduate school eventually, he is embracing the learning opportunities his job provides now. 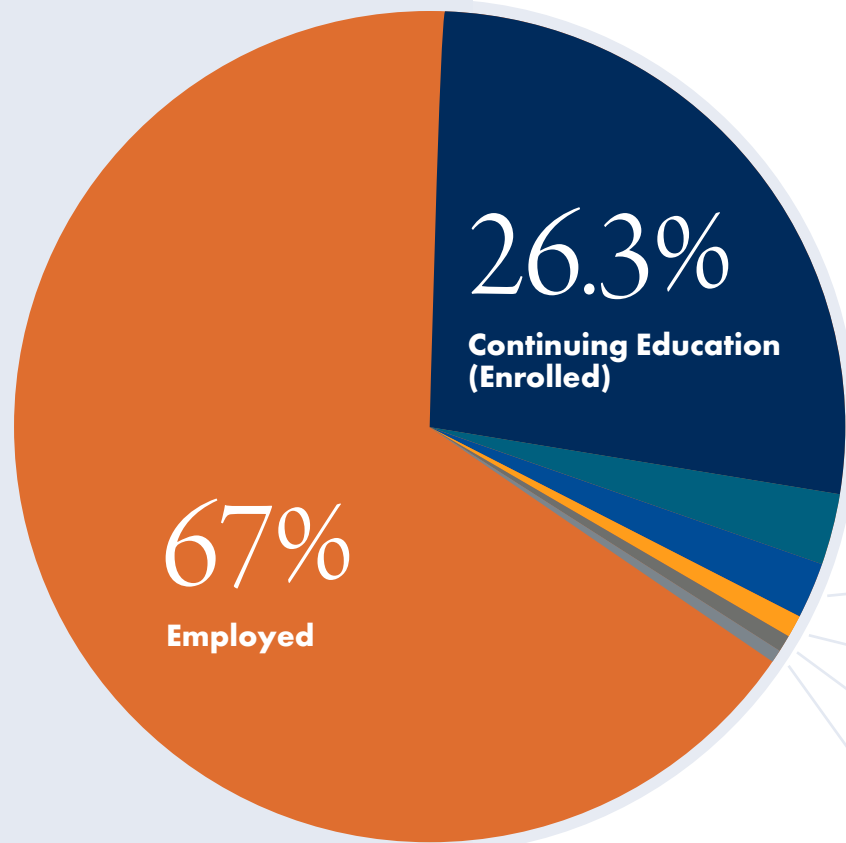

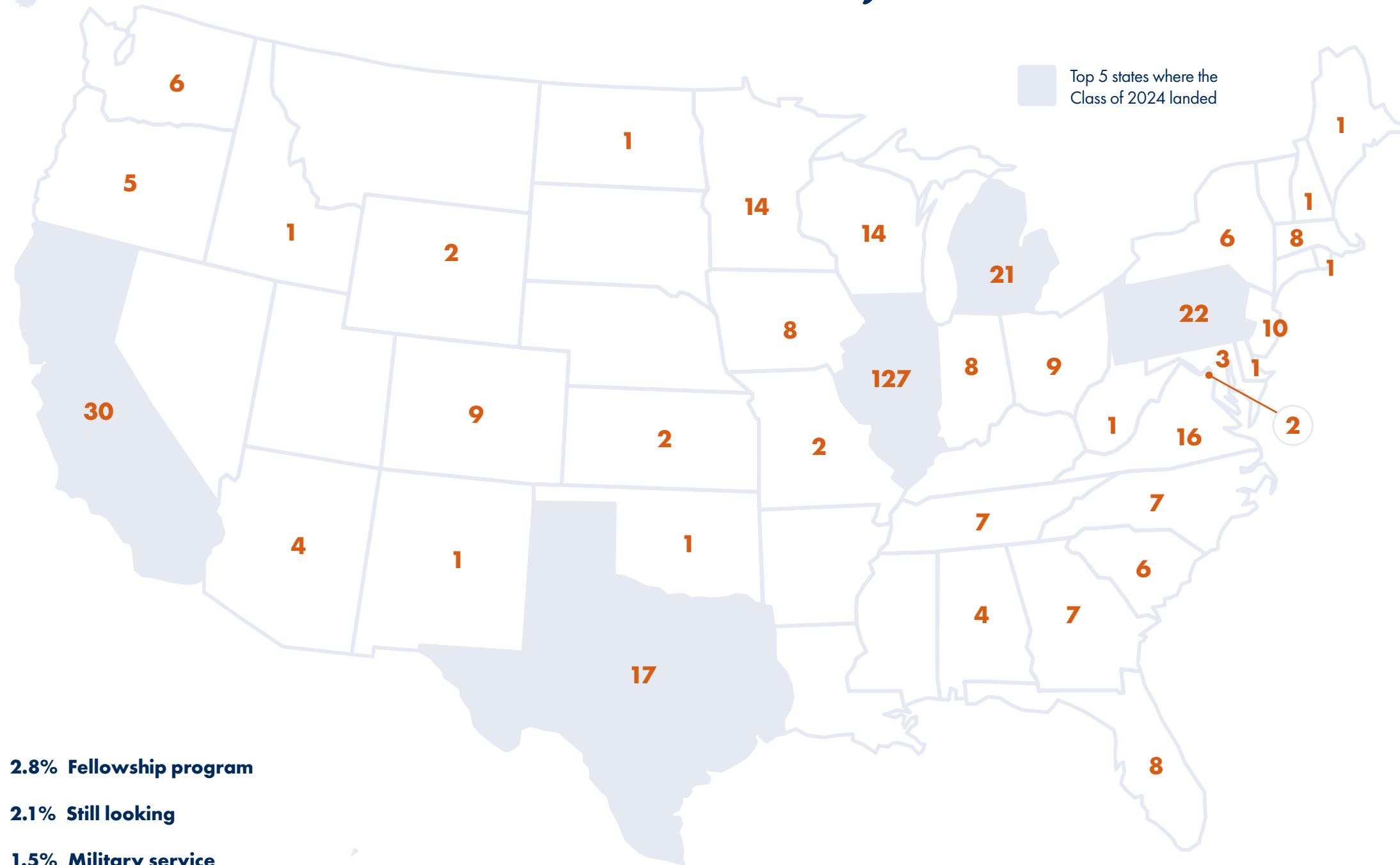
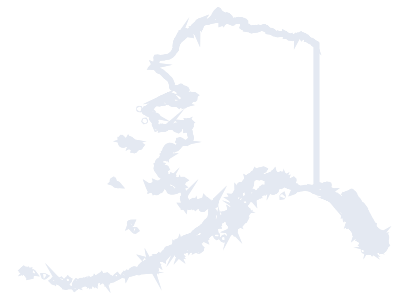

Major: Mathematics
Landed: MS in Business Analytics at University of Rochester, Simon Business School



"Be curious and pursue as many new experiences as possible," Nate advises current Wheaton students. Now pursuing an MS in Business Analytics at the University of Rochester's Simon Business School, Nate lives out his own advice. He discovered a passion for data analytics after taking a Data Science class during his first semester at Wheaton. Encouraged by conversations with his professor, he chose to major in Mathematics, and the analytical skills he built during his undergraduate studies are now a solid foundation for his graduate work. Active both on and off the court, Nate was a member of the Men's Basketball team and served on the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. Major: Political Science

During her time at Wheaton, Eyerusalem served in student government each of her four years, including time as co-president of the senior class. She was a Resident Assistant, worked on-campus as a library desk assistant and CVC ambassador, and worked off-campus at a local coffee shop. As she recalls her time at Wheaton, it is the mentors that left the deepest impact. "They supported me in times of spiritual need, they prayed with me, they spoke God's truth over me, and believed in me when I didn't believe in myself." Eyerusalem credits her time at Wheaton as the reason she is the deep-thinker she is today. "[My classes] made me realize how little I knew about the world, as well as pushed me to learn about God and his people more." A Faith, Politics, and Economics study abroad trip confirmed her decision to pursue the field of foreign policy, an idea initially birthed from living abroad. Encouraged by a fellow alumna, Eyerusalem applied for and was accepted into a highly-selective fellowship with the State Department, and is currently a Georgetown Security Studies student preparing for life as a diplomat. Eyerusalem encourages every student to find a mentor on campus. As much as she valued her peer relationships, "it's important to have individuals you love and respect who are rooting and praying for you as you become an adult and find who you are."
