The Institute for Cross Cultural Training (ICCT) is a fully self-funded academic center at Wheaton College. We hold to the college's motto that our work is wholly "for Christ and His Kingdom." ICCT equips Christians called to global service with skills in cross-cultural communication, language learning, and English teaching so they can serve their communities effectively and professionally.

How We Can Help

We can meet your organization's training and education needs for pre-field and on-field workers in language and culture learning, ESL teaching, and practical training for leaders and directors on the field. We offer donation-based consulting on procedures and policies for language and culture learning, consulting for ESL programs, and courses that equip cross-cultural workers. All of our courses are offered virtually at a variety of times throughout the year. We can offer cohorts and scheduling for your specific organization's needs.

Language Learner Training

<u>For those learning a new language</u>, we offer several fully online, asynchronous courses with flexible pacing to meet different learner and organizational needs and availability. Each course includes these three components:

- 1) <u>Foundations of Second Language Acquisition (SLA)</u>: An overall framework for language and culture learning, taught through videos, podcasts, readings, and application questions. Modules cover key principles of language acquisition and learners' own learning preferences.
- 2) <u>Language Learning Techniques (LLT)</u>: Learning and putting into practice a variety of tools and techniques to use with a language helper. **Each participant meets one-on-one with an instructor to get feedback on Foundations and LLT assignments.**
- 3) <u>Phonetics</u>: Short video lessons, individual practice drills, and **one-one video calls with a phonetics instructor**. Students have general phonetics lessons to learn about how sounds are produced with both independent and instructor-led practice, as well as specific phonetics lessons targeting the sound system of the language they are learning. (Yes, we can help students learning more than one language, as well!)

Language Coaching Courses

Fully online non-credit courses **equip coaches and field leaders** with practical preparation for helping cross-cultural workers to become more successful language and culture learners through videos, readings, forums, and application questions. Offered in set sessions throughout the year, though additional times may be available upon request. Participants are not required to be online at specific hours or on specific days.

English Teacher Training

We offer workshops and courses in English as a second language (ESL) teaching for those working with English language learners around the world. Our instructors have decades of experience and offer personal support to participants. All courses are offered synchronously (at the same time) via Zoom and occur on a biannual rotation, though they may also be offered at different times by special request. Some courses may be taken for college credit. Prices vary; discounts available.

English Teaching Courses

These courses are offered on alternating years in 10-week sessions, with one three-hour meeting per week.

Essentials of

Focus on gaining the skills necessary to diagnose errors and assist learners in improving their listening and production of the various elements of the English language.

Essentials of Teaching English Grammar

Focus on explaining the English grammar system and growing in ability to explain it clearly

Cross-Cultural Living & Ministry Course

For new and seasoned workers, <u>this course</u> provides a framework, tools, and activities to learn **each student's target culture's** patterns and values through videos, readings, and **weekly one-on-one video calls with an experienced instructor**. Topics include culture shock, orientations towards time, tasks, and crises, honor and shame, status vs. achievement, and more. Students are also guided in completing a culture practicum with a culture helper.

- **Location**: Take the course from anywhere in the world; no travel required, just a reliable internet connection.
- **Cost**: Compared to traditional, in-person programs that include travel and room and board costs, our programs are quite cost-effective.
- **Flexibility**: Participants can schedule study times and one-on-one meetings when it is convenient for them.
- Individualized assignments: Unlike a large-group class, our learning experiences are tailored to individual student needs. We use podcasts, videos, readings, discussion boards, reflection questions and video calls to keep participants engaged and use their time wisely.
- Focus on the target language: Our SLA courses help participants bridge
 the gap between general language training and on-field practical learning
 experiences for a strong focus on the target language to be learned.
 Phonetics instruction is also focused on the target language.
- Unlimited ongoing support: We give unlimited, free support to all those who go through our SLA and culture courses. Our goal is to "be there" through each step of the on-field language and culture learning process. While this is very labor-intensive on our part, it has proved to be a tremendous help to those who need ongoing guidance and encouragement, and so we have come to see this as a very important part of our ministry. We are also available to agency administrators who are dealing with issues related to the language and culture learning of their on-field personnel.
