

Job Description: Student Body President (Provided by 2024-25 Temporary Constitution)

A. Purpose.

- a. The executive authority of the Student Government Association shall be vested in the Student Body President. As such, the President shall serve as the primary representative and liaison between Student Government and the student body at large. In addition, the President will serve as the primary representative and liaison for Student Government and the student body at large to the rest of the college community, including faculty and administration.

B. Executive Authority.

- a. The President shall ultimately be responsible for the execution of all Student Government activity. As such, the President is primarily responsible for bringing proposals from the Board of Representatives to the Administration in a timely fashion. The President may sponsor proposals and pass motions.
 - i. Government Appointments. The President shall be responsible for making all Student Government appointments, including those to external entities (such as faculty committees, boards, and panels) subject to the approval of the voting membership.
 - ii. Committee Powers. The President shall appoint and coordinate committees to address campus concerns, subject to the approval of the voting membership and shall also be an ex-officio member of all Government committees.
 - iii. Retreat Planning. The President shall work with the Vice President in organizing the Fall Orientation and the Winter Retreat.

C. Representational Authority.

- a. The President shall establish and maintain relationships with members of the student body, faculty, administration, alumni, and trustees. Specific relationships are as follows:
 - i. Representation to the Faculty
 1. The Faculty Business Meeting. The President will be responsible for providing a report at each meeting.
 2. Faculty Council. The President shall serve as a member of and give regular reports to Faculty Council.
 - ii. Representation to the Administration
 1. The College President. The President shall meet with the College President on a regular basis to represent both student and, more

specifically, Student Government concerns to the College President and to be available to provide advice on college matters.

2. Student Development. The President shall join the Vice President in regularly meeting with the Vice President of Student Development.
3. Other Members. The President shall establish and maintain contact with other members of the administrative and staff structure of the College as the need arises.

iii. Representation to the Board of Trustees

1. The President shall serve as the student representative to the Student Development Committee (to which s/he shall give a regular report) and the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees. The President shall also serve as the student representative to the full Board of Trustees.
2. In the case of a necessary absence, the president shall appoint another representative from the Student Government board to attend the meeting in his/her stead.
